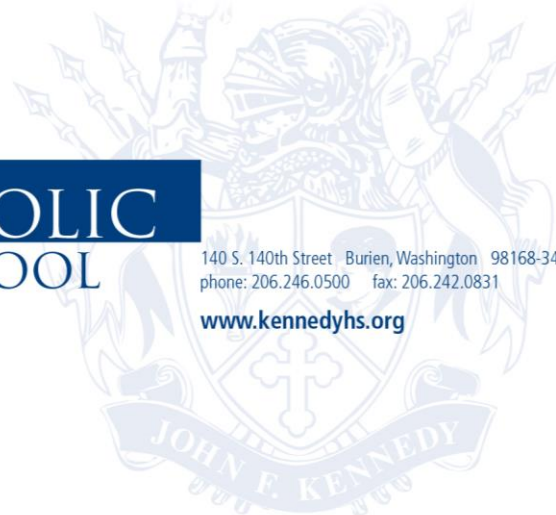


# KENNEDY CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL

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Dear Junior Parents,

The Third Annual Puget Sound Catholic Schools Case Studies program will be held on Thursday, April 27 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at Kennedy Catholic High School (KCHS). Nine schools from the Puget Sound area worked together to create this unique college admissions program **exclusively for juniors and their families.**

Approximately 500 students and families will be invited from Archbishop Murphy High School, Bellarmine Preparatory School, Bishop Blanchet High School, Eastside Catholic High School, Forest Ridge School of the Sacred Heart, Holy Names Academy, John F. Kennedy Catholic High School, O'Dea High School, and Seattle Preparatory School. These students will gather at KCHS to meet with roughly 30 college representatives, including those from John Hopkins, Rhodes College, University of Washington, University of San Diego and Whitman College.

The Puget Sound Catholic Schools Case Studies program is a way for students and parents to understand the application review process by being part of a simulated college admission committee. All participants will receive three application files to read and evaluate. With the help of the invited college representatives, students and parents will be divided into small committee groups. These groups will be responsible for reaching a consensus vote to admit, wait list, and deny the three students. Through this exercise, students and parents will have the opportunity to see how admission decisions are made and gain valuable insight into this complex process.
