School Social Worker



School Social Worker – SEL Support

Role of the School Social Worker

- Support students who may need more intensive social emotional support
- Coordinate care with outside services providers
- Partner with caregivers and families to support their student's success
- Students connected with social worker through referral



SBIRT = Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral To (services)

- Provides a snapshot of a student's immediate needs
- Focuses on prevention and brief intervention





Check Yourself Screener

- Voluntary, opt-out option for caregivers and students
- Confidential, information is kept secure
- Help students think about:
 - Personal & Family Strengths
 - Gender & Sexuality
 - Mental Health & Substance Use





Overall Goals

- Provide needed support and services
- Overcome identified challenges and barriers
- Promote student success at school, at home, and in the community

Student Athletes and NCAA Eligibility

Division I Requirements – 16 core courses in the following subjects

- 4 years English
- 3 years math at Algebra 1 level or higher
- 2 years natural or physical science
- 1 year of additional English, math or natural/physical science
- 2 years social science
- 4 years additional from above or other approved NCAA courses (ex: World Languages)
- Minimum required GPA: **2.300** (in the 16 core courses)



Things to Remember

- If students have received an "F" or "I" on their transcript, <u>credit for that</u> <u>class was not earned</u>. This credit may need to be retrieved. Have your student contact their counselor.
- "D" is a pass, but some colleges look for only "C's" and higher (example: California public colleges)
- Fine Arts classes are labeled "FA" on electives sheet
- Career and Technical Education classes are labeled "CTE" on elective sheet
- Some classes are labeled as both "FA" and "CTE," but they only serve
 as credit for one or the other requirement, not both simultaneously

CTE and FA credit classes*

Students can earn both CTE and FA credits in the following electives:

- Instrumental Music (all ensembles)
- Theatre Arts (all theatre classes)
- Visual Arts (all visual arts classes)
- Vocal Music (all ensembles)

*These courses satisfy either CTE or FA requirements, but not both simultaneously

Post-High School Options


- Two-year community college
- Four-year college
- Technical / Trade
 - Washington State Board for Community & Technical Colleges
- Gap year
- Military
 - Speak with recruiters at school visits or through ROTC programs at universities
 - Contact local recruiters through each branch's website (Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard)



College & Career Planning

- Get involved in the community (school, local, church, etc.)
- Find out college / career entrance requirements (start with Naviance)
- Schedule appropriate classes for intended major / career; increase academic rigor if possible
- Do well in rigorous courses to maintain a strong GPA
- Attend college visits and college fairs in fall and spring
- Use Naviance to explore personality traits, career options, and learning habits (Parent accounts were created and sent out this evening)
- Take advantage of the summer: volunteer (beyond the ISLE hours!), internships, pre-college programs, community college course (major / career related that Kennedy does not offer)
 - These opportunities are posted on Canvas and shared in the E-News

Take the PSAT

- Take the PSAT in the fall of junior year utilize score report to look for areas of strength / deficit
- Qualify for scholarship and College Board National Recognition Program awards
- Access free resources for SAT / ACT prep Khan Academy
- Prepares students to take the SAT / ACT in spring of junior year repeat in summer if necessary
- Meet with your college & career counselor to make a plan

Things to consider:

- Does the college require test scores?
- Is the college test-optional or test-blind?
- Does my GPA align well with the colleges / universities?
